



Bayford Primary School Pupil Premium Statement

Schools receive a Pupil Premium payment for any child who has been in receipt of free school meals (FSM) any time during the last 6 years, who has been in continuous care (CLA) for 6 months or more, or who has a parent in the armed forces.

The range of provision the Headteacher and Governors may consider for these children could include the following:

- Providing small group work with an experienced teacher focussed on overcoming gaps in learning
- 1-2-1 support
- Additional teaching and learning opportunities provided through learning mentors, trained TAs or external agencies
- Providing a TA in the classroom so that the teacher is freed up to support those children whose need is greatest

Work through the pupil premium will be aimed at accelerating progress, moving children to at least age related expectations. The premium may also be used to target able children on FSM to achieve greater than age related expectations.

September 2017 to August 2018

In 2017-18 the amount allocated per pupil was £1,320. Bayford Primary School will receive £7,920 for the current year.

Funding will be targeted to address current barriers to learning, which include: writing, maths and behavioural issues.

During 2017-18 the funding is planned as follows, with the impact reviewed at across the year through Pupil Progress Meetings and end of year assessments:

Impact of Pupil Premium

2016-2017

In 2016-2017 Y6 children were in receipt of Pupil Premium funding but there were no Y2 children. The KS2 results were as follows:

- In reading, 100% of children in receipt of pupil premium achieved the expected standard. This was higher than non-pupil premium children (71%) and higher than the national average (71%)
- In writing, 100% of children in receipt of pupil premium achieved the expected standard. This was higher than non-pupil premium children (71%) and higher than the national average (76%)
- In maths, 100% of children in receipt of pupil premium achieved the expected standard. This was higher than non-pupil premium children (79%) and higher than the national average (75%)
