



## Bayford Primary School Pupil Premium Statement

Schools receive a Pupil Premium payment for any child who has been in receipt of free school meals (FSM) any time during the last 6 years, who has been in continuous care (CLA) for 6 months or more, or who has a parent in the armed forces.

The range of provision the Headteacher and Governors may consider for these children could include the following:

- Providing small group work with an experienced teacher focussed on overcoming gaps in learning
- 1-2-1 support
- Additional teaching and learning opportunities provided through learning mentors, trained TAs or external agencies
- Providing a TA in the classroom so that the teacher is freed up to support those children whose need is greatest

Work through the pupil premium will be aimed at accelerating progress, moving children to at least age related expectations. The premium may also be used to target able children on FSM to achieve greater than age related expectations.

### September 2018 to August 2019

In 2018-19 the amount allocated per pupil is £1,320. Bayford Primary School will receive £9,240 for the current year.

Funding will be targeted to address current barriers to learning, which include: EYFS goals, writing, maths and behavioural issues.

During 2018-19 the funding is planned as follows, with the impact reviewed at across the year through Pupil Progress Meetings and end of year assessments:

1-2-1 support	Teacher to work 1-2-1 with Class 3 children to prepare for Maths and English SATs.	£1080
TA support	Small group/1-2-1 teaching in EYFS & Class 2 in phonics, writing and maths to address gaps in learning.	£6970
Opportunity funding	Places on school journeys, trips and extra-curricular opportunities to enable participation where finance might be a limiting factor.	£1000
Family Support Worker	Support for parents and children at home and at school.	£200

## **Impact of Pupil Premium**

### **2017-2018**

In 2017-2018, 2 x Y6 children were in receipt of Pupil Premium funding and 1 x Y2 child (who achieved the expected standard in reading and writing).

The KS2 results were as follows:

- In reading, 100% of children in receipt of pupil premium achieved the expected standard. This was the same as non-pupil premium children (100%) and higher than the national average (75%)
- In writing, 50% of children in receipt of pupil premium achieved the expected standard. This was lower than non-pupil premium children (100%) and lower than the national average (78%)
- In maths, 100% of children in receipt of pupil premium achieved the expected standard. This was the same as non-pupil premium children (100%) and higher than the national average (76%)
